ILA 1624 SCHOLARSHIP FUND

ILA Local 1624 has set up a scholarship fund that would constitute three \$2,000.00 scholarships which are available each year.

A committee of three Local members has been set up to oversee this fund.

Qualifications are below:

- 1. A member must have 10 years of good service in ILA Local 1624 (700 hours per year) in order to apply for his or her dependent.
- 2. The child must be natural born or adopted and under custody or fully dependent on the member, as reflected on the prior year's income tax return.
- 3. Children of retirees or children of a retiree's widow or widower (widow or widower must be drawing pensions) are eligible.
- 4. The applicant must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment at an accredited institution on a full-time basis.
- 5. Scholarships are available for Associate or Bachelor degrees at the college level or an accredited business or trade school. If it is a trade or business school, ILA Local 1624 must receive a letter of accreditation from said school.
- 6. The applicant must be unmarried.
- 7. The selection will be based on academic merit and achievement.

A committee of one professor from Old Dominion University and one professor from Norfolk State University and one high school senior counselor from a local school system will make the final decisions of which applicants will receive the scholarships.

All applicants must include the following in their application material for a scholarship:

- 1. <u>TRANSCRIPTS:</u> Include Standardized Test Scores. This can be an unofficial copy of transcripts.
- 2. <u>THREE LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:</u> At least two of the three letters should be from teachers and/or administrators.
- 3. <u>A GOAL STATEMENT AND THE REASONS FOR YOUR GOAL:</u> At least one paragraph in length.
- 4. **LIST OF EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:** This should include the amount of hours per month dedicated to these activities. Please include community service.
